We encourage everyone to be a light to others, so they can make a positive difference today and in the future.

As an Anglican Methodist school, we are rooted in the heritage of John Wesley who, 'Like a burning brand', was plucked from his house fire and later became the founder of the Methodist movement as his heart was 'strangely warmed' by the Holy Spirit. Just as he shone, our vision is for everyone to celebrate their uniqueness and go on to shine and flourish as they aspire to fulfil their potential.

We are mindful that the core of Jesus' ministry was God's heart of love to bring dignity and restoration to every human being, regardless of culture, disability, sex, language, racial origin, religious belief and sexual orientation. As Paul wrote, 'You are all one in Christ Jesus' (Galations 3:28) and so we aim to mirror this example of positivity, inclusivity, forgiveness and love within our school community and beyond.

Our values were chosen by our school community and are at the core of everything we do. Weaving through our school life like a thread and guiding us in our decision making and actions, they enable us to live out our vision.

Putting our values into action, we strive to grow children who echo our Methodist heritage in the sentiments of John Wesley:
